RULE 1: DO NO HARM

۲

It is therefore expected of all who continue therein that they should continue to evidence their desire of salvation by **doing no harm**, by avoiding evil of every kind, especially that which is most generally practiced, such as:

- The taking of the name of God in vain.
- The profaning the day of the Lord, either by doing ordinary work therein or by buying or selling.
- Drunkenness: buying or selling spirituous liquors, or drinking them, unless in cases of extreme necessity.
- Slaveholding: buying or selling slaves.
- Fighting, quarreling, brawling, brother going to law with brother; returning evil for evil, or railing for railing; the using many words in buying or selling.
- The buying or selling of goods that have not paid the duty.
- The giving or taking things on usury—i.e., unlawful interest.
- Uncharitable or unprofitable conversation; particularly speaking evil of magistrates or of ministers.
- Doing to others as we would not they should do unto us.
- Doing what we know is not for the glory of God, as:
 - -The putting on of gold and costly apparel.
 - -The taking such diversions as cannot be used in the name of the Lord Jesus.
 - -The singing those songs, or reading those books, which do not tend to the knowledge or love of God.
 - -Softness and needless self-indulgence.
 - -Laying up treasure upon earth.
 - -Borrowing without a probability of paying: or taking up goods without a probability of paying for them.

"Spirituous liquors" is another way of saying "alcoholic beverages"

Railing is an eighteenthentury word for verbal abuse.

> See Exodus

Wesley is saying that Christians shouldn't take each other to court. See Matthew 5:23-26.

The more words someone uses in buying and selling, the more likely they are to cheat a person out of money or merchandise.

> A duty is a tax placed on certain goods. "Goods that have not paid the duty" are items being sold on the black market.

Magistrates and ministers are local and national political leaders.

ou may recognize this is a ersion of the Golden Rule, from Matthew 7:12.

"Laying up treasure upon earth" refers to Jesus's teaching in Matthew 6:19-21 and Luke 12:13-21.



RULE 3: STAY IN LOVE WITH GOD

THE GENERAL RULES

۲

It is therefore expected of all who continue therein that they should continue to evidence their desire of salvation by **attending upon all the ordinances of God**; such are:

- The public worship of God.
- The ministry of the Word, either read or expounded.
- The Supper of the Lord.
- Family and private prayer.
- Searching the Scriptures.
- Fasting or abstinence.

This, in other words, mean "go to church."

The word *expounded* includes listening to sermons

This is also known as Holy Communion or the Eucharist.

Fasting and abstinence aren't limited to refraining from food and sexual activity. A person could also fast from television or their phone; someone could abstain from insulting others or complaining.
